It is usually very well attended and a good time to start coming to book discussions as we learn so much about other group members' personal reading tastes and interests!

February 20, 2008 – *Ledyard: In Search of the First American Explorer* - Bill Gifford.

John Ledyard was one of the first well known explorers at the birth of this nation. Born in Groton, CT, he met Thomas Jefferson, Lewis and Clark, Captain Cook, Lafayette, John Paul Jones and a host of other well known politicians and explorers or the era. This biography talks about the complicated man who set outrageous exploration goals and traveled far from Ledyard while being one of the first to talk about the basics of "multiculturalism." Idealistic and mercenary, restless and lazy, with a history of tantrums and fistfights, John Ledyard was a man readers will find fascinating and intriguing.

March 19, 2008 – *An Arsonist's Guide to Writer's Homes in New England* – Brock Clarke.

"This book is the delightfully dark story of Sam Pulsifer, the accidental arsonist and murderer/narrator who leads readers through a multi-layered, flamefilled adventure about literature, lies, love and life. Growing up in Amherst, Mass., with an editor for a father and an English teacher for a mother, Sam was fed endless stories that fueled (literally and figuratively) the rest of his life. Thus, the blurred boundaries between fact and fiction, story and reality become the landscape for amusing and provocative adventures that begin when, at age 18, Sam accidentally torches the Emily Dickinson Homestead, killing two people. After serving 10 years, Sam tries to distance himself from his past through college, employment, marriage and fatherhood, but he eventually winds up back in his parents' home. separated from his wife and jobless. When more literary landmarks go up in flames, Sam is the likely suspect, and his determination to find the actual arsonist uncovers family secrets and more than a bit about human nature." (From Publishers Weekly.)

It's Winter Reading Time Again

For your Listening Pleasure

No time to read? Why not try an audio book? The libraries provide audio books in multiple formats. In addition to Books on Tape and Books on CD we also provide "Downloadable" audio books and "Playaways".



The downloadable books are available through the library webpage at <u>www.ledyard.lioninc.org</u>. Choose from hundreds of popular titles right from your web browser and access them with our free OverDrive Media Console software.

Click the graphic on the webpage or the link in the library catalog to search for a book, download it to your computer, and play it back. Downloads may be transferred to a compatible MP3 player and some titles may be burned to a CD. A list of compatible devices (sorry, iPod?s aren?t on the list.) is available on the site, along with easy to follow downloading instructions. The book is available to you for two weeks and it may be renewed if no one is waiting for it. A valid Ledyard Library card is required to complete the download



If you like audio books but don't like downloading them and getting them onto your MP3 player, you can try the PlayAway book. Each one is about the size of a small MP3 player and is preloaded with a complete book. The unit uses one AAA battery and works with earphones or with an

adapter through a speaker system in a car. Earphones and adapters are not provided.

Services to the Homebound

With the arrival of cold days and icy roads, it is more difficult for everyone to get to the library. Some of you may not be aware that we offer delivery service to patrons who are unable to get to the library due to lack of transportation or illness. Even if this is a temporary situation, we are happy to put you on the homebound delivery list until you are able to resume library visits.

Homebound delivery can be tailored to meet individual needs. There is a convenient "Service to the Homebound" questionnaire available at the libraries which can be used to let the librarians know what types of materials you would be interested in receiving. We are happy to choose books, tapes or movies for you based on your questionnaire. If you want specific items, you may call either library and request that they be delivered to you. You may also search the library catalog on line and request books and other materials. We will call or e-mail, depending on your preference, when the items arrive and homebound delivery can be arranged at that time.

Local History Room

The Local History Room at Bill Library has undergone major renovations in the last year and we are pleased to announce it will soon be open to the public on a regular basis. It began



with a moisture problem in the room which led to mold on the bookcase walls. Clean-up of the mold resulted in the disposal of all the wooden book shelves in the room. The room was thoroughly cleaned and each book was "Hepa" vacuumed. The windows were replaced, the walls repaired and the room repainted. New metal shelving, which is less



harmful to books, was special ordered to fit the configuration of the room. The room is round and fitting the new shelves was no easy task. The new shelving units have wooden end panels and a

wooden top which gives the appearance of a built in bookcase. Funding for the shelving came from the Ledyard Historical Society, the Friends of the Library and a Bodenwein Grant. We are grateful to these organizations for their support.

Friends News

The Library Friends held their annual meeting in October to review the fall book sale, elect officers and disburse funds raised during the year. The major source of funding for the Friends include the book sales held at each library, the on-going book sale, dues, and the items that they sell such as the book bags and cats meow cutouts of each library. The members agreed to fund several items for the libraries including an ergonomic computer table, an OPAC table and a bench seat for Bill Library, shelving for Gales Ferry Library, printers for both libraries and more. In addition they will fund programs for children, teens and adults, museum passes to circulate, and publicity materials.
