Borrow a kit for 3 weeks and learn how you can save money on your electric costs.



The Ledyard Public Library has been a gifted a new 3D Printer from CreativeBug. This printer has an impressive footprint utilizing PLA plastic. It operates on the Library's free Wifi using Sculpto, an app with the same name as the printer, connecting from a mo-

bile device. In getting started and exploring the nuances of the printer, Lisa decided to print a Baby Yoda (the character from The Mandalorian on Disney+) using an open source website called Thingiverse.



Baby Yoda has proven to

be very popular with patrons who have asked for one of their own. To get your own Baby Yoda or something of your choosing we ask for a donation to cover the cost of the materials. Depending upon the strength and structure of the model, printing times vary. However, we are very impressed with this quiet and sturdy 3D printer.
