WINTER SOWING ...

- Trudi Davidoff started winter sowing >20 years
- Sow seeds in an enclosed container
- Start seeds outdoors in winter cold, snow, rain
- Seeds germinate in spring when seeds are "ready".
- Seedlings are very strong, drought tolerate
- Cost savings











WHEN?

Sow: Late Dec – Mar 21

- Seeds experience natural fluctuation in winter climate
 - ❖ Natural stratification / scarification
- Read seed packet instructions:
 - ✓ Ignore temperature / precautions against frost
 - ✓ Follow light / darkness needs
 - ✓ Follow planting depth needs









form of Celosia with its strange scarlet combs that are furrowed and lobed. Still today, the shockingly curious flowers of the Cockscomb delight visitors to Monticello.

Direct sow seeds outdoors after the last spring frost in fertile, well-drained garden soil. Alternatively, start seeds indoors 4-6 weeks before last frost, then harden off and transplant outdoors after last frost. Approximately 70-75 seeds per packet.

WHY WINTER SOW?

- Simple, efficient and fun winter project
 - No grow lights or heated greenhouse
 - Winter-sown seedlings are hardy
 - No leggy seedlings planted and grown outdoors.
 - Acclimated to outdoor conditions No need to harden off the seedlings
 - Plant when outside temperature has warmed.
 - Prevents seeds from being washed away or eaten by birds.




